## Dear Friends

We, as Bishop and Director of Catholic Education, wish to make a very clear statement of our solidarity with all survivors of sexual abuse and our absolute commitment to the safety of children and other vulnerable people in our schools and all other Church settings.

The Church, in collaboration with Catholic Education, has implemented many child safety measures that are constantly reviewed and assessed.

Earlier this week, the Australian Catholic Bishop's Conference released the following statement regarding recent media coverage on Cardinal George Pell:

The news of Cardinal George Pell's conviction on historical child sexual abuse charges has shocked many across Australia and around the world, including the Catholic Bishops of Australia.

The Bishops agree that everyone should be equal under the law, and we respect the Australian legal system. The same legal system that delivered the verdict will consider the appeal that the Cardinal's legal team has lodged. Our hope, at all times, is that through this process, justice will be served.

In the meantime, we pray for all those who have been abused and their loved ones, and we commit ourselves anew to doing everything possible to ensure that the Church is a safe place for all, especially the young and the vulnerable.

It is also important to remember, we, as members of our Church family, that our faith is based on Jesus. He promised to be with us always, regardless of how difficult things can be.
