School Start Times and Our 'Duty of Care'.

There has been some concern recently about how EARLY some students come to school and WHO should look after them. We call this 'duty of care'. When your children are at school, we (the school) have a legal duty of care – to look after them as you would expect. But when does this start?

As a reminder, breakfast begins at 7:45 am and finishes at 8:30 am. Staff are expected to be at school by 8 am and students, from 8:30 am. Some students arrive at 7:30 am - a whole HOUR too soon!

Looking ahead, the following rules apply:

- School's legal duty of care will begin at <u>7:45 am</u>.
- JP will serve breakfast from then and a staff member will supervise students.
- The gates will be locked until 7:45 am. We will not have duty of care for your children before 7:45 am.
- If a staff member has children who are students, they will look after them until 7:45 am.
