Dear Families,

We're now in the second part of Term 1. School has been getting 30 – 40 students (out of 140) each day. That's about ¼ or 25% attendance. Meanwhile, we hear that the worst of the COVID-19 outbreak might be over and things will get easier from here. <u>Please send your children back to school as soon as possible</u>. **Education is a legal requirement**. If children are home because of COVID isolation or your family's anxiety / worry over COVID, then they <u>must</u> do the Home Learning Packs. These will be collected from you every two weeks by school staff. The staff would also like to talk to you about how the packs are going. New packs will be given, which your child is expected to do until he / she returns to school.

Last week, we celebrated **Ash Wednesday** with a special COVID-Safe *liturgy* (ceremony). Students stayed in their classrooms. Fr Elmer stayed in his presbytery. Communication was through ZOOM. To avoid touching when making the sign of the cross on the forehead, teachers sprinkled ashes on people's heads. It was a successful ceremony and we thank our Religious Education Coordinator, Rosie, and Fr Elmer for organising it in the way that they did.



Last year, our Senior students asked if they could have a special **Seniors Uniform**. Many schools let their oldest students have this. It's a privilege. In return, we expect students to set a good example with their work and behaviour. Our new Seniors uniforms are the same design as 'yellow tops' but have the **Ltyentyies colours!** They look GREAT! OTHER NEWS:

Last year our staff were trained in the **MindUp for Schools** program by a senior psychologist from Catholic Education Northern Territory. MindUp is a classroom based social and emotional learning program. It increases student self-awareness, social awareness, attention, self-regulation, problem-solving and prosocial behaviour. We're excited to use this program at LACS and are looking forward to making it a regular part of our weekly programs to support students.
