# Werte, Ltyentye Apurte families.

The **Preschool Reform Agreement** is a Federal Government initiative that makes it possible for young children to have up to two years in preschool. Research shows that this helps children to be more successful in later school years. **New rules apply for Ltyentye Apurte Catholic <u>Preschool</u>:** 

- Preschool can take children aged **3 to 5 years old**.
- Children aged 3 to 3 ½ <u>must</u> be with an adult family / carer. (This cannot be a member of our current Preschool staff).
- ALL Preschool children <u>MUST be toilet trained</u>. We do not have nappy changing facilities at school.
- We will not accept 'visiting' children in Preschool for longer than two days. After that they must be enrolled at school or taken home. Anyone wanting a child to attend Preschool must be seen by Office staff or Principal / Deputy Principal <u>first</u>.

We support the CRÈCHE run by Council. <u>Sending your child</u> to the Crèche is also good for their education.

- Crèche is open from 8 am to 3 pm.
- Crèche still takes children 0 5 years old.
- Crèche <u>has</u> nappy changing facilities. IF your child is not toilet trained, they should go Crèche.
- <u>Preschool will drive students to Crèche at 12:30 pm</u>. If you want them to go to Crèche after Preschool, sign form with Nellie, Delphina or Nalita.
